The Smithsonian Institution Columbus Quincentenary Program commemorates the voyages of Columbus to the Americas through exhibitions, symposia, publications, and a television program. The commemoration focuses on the cultural, historical, and scientific implications of the encounter in this hemisphere that will continue to be of global importance into the twenty-first century. The Smithsonian's observance, coordinated by the Office of Quincentenary Planning, includes the participation of the Smithsonian's art, history, and science museums and offices. A new Civil War roster contains histories of several regiments of North Carolina troops, including the 51st (which fought against the famous black regiment whose story was depicted in the award-winning movie, *Glory*). Histories of the 49th, 50th, 51st, and 52nd regiments and the names and service records of more than 6,000 Tar Heels who served in those units appear in Volume XII of *North Carolina Troops, 1861-1865: A Roster*, edited by Weymouth T. Jordan, Jr., and published by the Historical Publications Section. Three of the four featured regiments had careers of considerable interest. The 51st was positioned on the other side of the wall at Fort Wagner when the "Glory" regiment, the 54th Massachusetts, attacked on July 18, 1863. The 49th was involved in the bloody fighting at Sharpsburg (Antietam) and The Crater, and the 52nd was decimated in the Pickett-Pettigrew Charge at Gettysburg. Individual service records contain information such as county of birth and residence, age at time of enlistment, prewar occupation, promotions, desertions, instances of injury and capture, and place, date, and cause of death. The 585-page volume includes an index, introduction, and ten photographs of North Carolina soldiers and sells for \$27, plus \$3 for postage. Civil War Manuscripts, compiled with an introduction by John Sellars, comprises 1,064 descriptions of collections, or parts of collections, of papers in the Library of Congress Manuscript Division directly related to the Civil War. These papers, many of them personal letters and journals of soldiers and civilians who fought and endured the war, bring this important chapter in American history into immediate and vivid focus.
