Oak Grove Baptist Church

ments are now on file and Oak Grove Southern Missionary Baptist Chuch was constituted in April 1891 as Caison's Chapel. Named after Caroline Caison, the daughter of John and Barbara Andrews Caison. The name was changed in 1895 to Oak Grove Southern Missionwas held on April 14, 1991 in the church's third building. Five former pastors were present and

> After the first building was destroyed by fire in 1910 a second building was erected in 1912, a oneroom, 24 by 28 foot frame structure with bay window, bell and belfry. This building was located in front of the Oak Grove Cemetery and faced the intersection of Empire Road and highway NC 130. In 1950 the church was remodeled and four classrooms were added. During 1960-1971 three more classrooms and two bathrooms were constructed. Lumber was supplied from the James Walker and Annie Victoria Hewett Family estate.

> The church broke ground on January 7, 1973 for the third building which it has occupied since March 5, 1978. This church is located approximately one-third mile from the original site on property donated by Olen and Martha Cheers Clemmons, with additional acreage given in December 1980 by Dayton and Lou Ellen Clemmons Rhodes. Work on the fellowship hall began in 1982 and was completed 1985, with porch and breezeway added. Later, stained glass windows and a fiberglass steeple were installed. Groundbreaking was held for a new parsonage in September 1998.

> Revivals were held in the spring and fall of 1998. There were 19 new members added, of these 10 were by baptism.

> From its start with 27 members, Oak Grove has

continued to grow in membership each year. The Lewis McCall family and other members of the church has reported a Sunday School since its beginning.

Since 1891 the church has called about 24 different pastors starting with the Rev. E.L. Swain and including Rev. Tom Johnson, Rev. Mack Gore, Rev. Leo Cannon, Rev. Laurie Evans, Rev. Albert Young and many others. During the years of growth, Oak Grove dropped Southern Missionary Baptist and is now known by Oak Grove Baptist Chruch.



2nd Oak Grove Baptist Church

Oak Grove has licensed three ministers, Rev. John Hewett on December 10, 1049, Rev. Emery Hewett on and Rev. Laury Evans and ordained Rev. Emery Hewett on February 12, 1949 and Rev. Laury Evans on January 14, 1979. Music has always played an important role in Oak Grove ministry. The church, on a regular basis, invites singing groups to perform at the church. The congregation also presents dramas at Easter and Christmas.

Oak Grove has been a member of the Cape Fear Association, 1891-1898; of Cape Fear-Columbus Association, 1899 and the Brunswick Association since 1899. The church hosted the Associational Meeting in 1916 and again in 1998.

The parishioners recently renovated the front entrance of the church and made a very warm and inviting foyer with donations by the Frances Holden Clausing, Amy Clausing Clemmons family, Richard and Christine Hewett family, Gene and Gracie Hewett Evans family, Dwight and Mary church and community.

Note of interest: Declared Dead - All persons previously reported as missing or missing in action, who were no longer presumed to be living, and in whose cases a finding of death was made by the Chief of the Casualty Branch, AGO, acting for the Secretary of War, pursuant to section 5 of the "Missing Persons act," Public Law 490, 77th Congress, 7 March 1942, as amended. Finding of death were made upon or subsequent to 12 months in a missing or missing in action status, and were withheld so long as the person was presumed to be living. They included the date upon which the death was presumed to have occurred for the purposes of termination of crediting pay and allowances, settlements of accounts, and payments of death gratuities. Such date was never less than a year and a day following the day of expiration of the 12 month period. The declared dead column in this report include those persons classified as declared dead from a missing in action status only. Persons declared dead from a missing status (other than missing in action) are included in the non-battle death statistics in the death tables, but are not separately identified.
